The American Council for Construction Education (ACCE) is a 501(c)(3) private non-profit corporation. The mission of ACCE is to be a leading global advocate of quality construction education; and to promote, support, and accredit quality construction education programs. The primary goal is promotion and continued improvement of postsecondary construction education; specifically, ACCE accredits construction education programs in colleges and universities that request its evaluation and meet its standards and criteria.

ACCE is recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) as the accrediting agency for 4-year baccalaureate degree programs in construction, construction science, construction management, and construction technology, and as the accrediting agency for two-year associate-degree programs of a like nature.

Organized in 1974 by the American Institute of Constructors, the constructor's

professional organization, and the Associated Schools of Construction, ACCE enjoys the support of the principal building and contracting national associations and academic institutions seeking to satisfy the needs for well educated and trained entrants into the constructor profession.

By working together under the aegis of ACCE, persons representative of the total construction community and the public at large, construction educators and constructors, establish and maintain standards and criteria for accreditation, provide guidance to those seeking to achieve accredited status, and carry out the accreditation and reaccreditation processes. In doing so, ACCE serves the interests of potential students by helping them identify institutions and programs that offer quality education in the field, and serves the interests of the industry by enabling employers to identify persons who, by reason of their education and training, have the potential for making lasting contributions to the industry and their profession. ACCE also serves the interests of

owners/users of constructed facilities and the public at large by raising the professional caliber of constructors and thus the quality of the construction for which they assume responsibility.

ACCE and the Chartered Institute of Building in the United Kingdom have a reciprocity agreement whereby ACCE recognizes university degree programs accredited by the Chartered Institute of Building as equivalent to baccalaureate programs accredited by ACCE. In turn, CIOB recognizes baccalaureate programs accredited by ACCE as equivalent to university degree programs accredited by CIOB. This agreement was the culmination of a period of evaluation by both parties embracing academic standards comparability, exchange of procedural information and reciprocal observation of accreditation visits.



This past year has been characterized by transition. Notable change has occurred in our national headquarters leadership and location; notable change has occurred in our accreditation activities and scope; notable change has occurred in our leadership development and advancement within the Council; and, notable change has occurred within our steady ranks.

Dedicated and sagacious effort on the part of the special task force charged with identifying the best possible replacement for Dan Dupree brought Mike Holland forward as their recommended choice. He was quickly approved by the Executive Committee and given a solid endorsement by the Board at the mid-year meeting. Dan stayed in office officially until 1 May when his retirement became effective. At that time Mike assumed the leadership mantle and we have never looked back. The several months of overlap from February to May provided ample opportunity for Mike to get familiar with ACCE activities and procedures before Dan gave up his official duties.

The change in our full time Executive Vice-President was accompanied by a change in location of the national head-quarters. With Mike's assumption of duties, the headquarters office moved to San Antonio, Texas where we will enjoy excellent airline links to a wide variety of hubs and other cities. There being no lack of good dining and entertainment in San Antonio as well as the technical support we shall need increasingly in the future, we can look forward to enjoying our new address.

We celebrated Dan and Jehnell's devotion to the Council at a testimonial dinner held during the Annual Meeting in St. Louis. Many past and present members of the Council gathered to pay homage to Dan and Jehnell. Among the tributes offered at this time was the designation of our long term endowment, defined to assure viability of the Council, as the "Dan and Jehnell Dupree Construction Education Fund." Now is a good time to make your contribution to this worthwhile fund. Also on this occasion in St. Louis, we recognized the impressive work of Susan Allen, our former administrative assistant, who left our employ due to the office relocation from Monroe. We shall sorely miss Susan who made calling the office like calling home.



In our mainstream business of accreditation, we accredited four new programs and reaccredited nine. A total of twentyeight progress reports were also processed. All in all, this was a heavy year for the accreditation committee and I thank them officially in this report. The four new programs include the Saskatchewan Institute of Applied Science and Technology, our first non-US accreditation. Significantly, in the same international arena, an ACCE delegation visited the country of China to observe accreditation activities. We subsequently executed a Letter of Intent with the National Board for Construction Management Accreditation of China to work toward a reciprocal agreement. Back on the national scene, we have advanced Non-Degree Recognition with preparation for two Pilot Program visitations. All of these activities extend the reach and influence of ACCE. As of the year end we number fifty-seven accredited four-year programs and ten accredited two-year programs with six and three as candidates in each of those categories.

We have re-structured leadership training with a strategic plan for a sustainable program for the Council. This program recognizes the passage of a leadership generation and the emergence of younger members to carry the Council forward. Concurrently, we have energized membership development and marketing plans with both internal and external help. Generous donations of time and resources help this to happen and the long-term payoff will benefit all members as well as the industry. We have redefined the reorganization task force as the Internal Audit Task Force and gave them an overall charge to both look at what we are doing and identify what we should be doing. Initially they will focus on the upcoming report to CHEA.

We enjoyed a third year of partnership with the Hospital Corporation of America sponsoring a golf tournament in Nashville, Tennessee. Mike Holland addressed the assembled participants and was warmly applauded. Participation overall exceeded that of last year with proceeds in the amount of \$ 28,500 going to our member programs and \$51,000 overall, for scholarships and \$ 9,000 going to the Council as discretionary capital. We are grateful to HCA and the tournament participants for this very welcome infusion of goodwill and financial support. Special thanks are extended to Tommy Yeager of HCA, Tournament Chair; Drew White of HCA for continuing support in many ways; Tom Gormley of HCA and Joey Hatch and Skanska for their very strong support.

Finally, we have experienced a year of sadness with the untimely passing of two strong members from our active body. Dr. Arlan Toy, Past Chair at Southern Polytechnic, died suddenly in September from heart surgery complications. Past President Bill Normand died after a long struggle against cancer in October. Both men will be remembered well for their leadership and many contributions to the industry and academia. On the personal side, we shall miss their warm friendship and love of the Council.

Overall, I am pleased to report that the Council is strong and continues to fulfill its mission and appurtenant responsibilities with conscience, enthusiasm and wisdom. That strength comes from the ever willing posture of the membership to take on the duties essential to our continuing and future success. You have all contributed greatly to this success and I am grateful for the role that each and every one of you has filled. I have valued your counsel as well as your work. We are now embarking on a new chapter in the life of ACCE. I invite all to participate to the fullest in an enterprise of which we are all proud.
