The American Council for Construction Education (ACCE) is a 501(c)(3) private non-profit corporation. The mission of ACCE is to be a leading global advocate of quality construction education; and to promote, support, and accredit quality construction education programs. The primary goal is promotion and continued improvement of postsecondary construction education; specifically, ACCE accredits construction education programs in colleges and universities that request its evaluation and meet its standards and criteria.

ACCE is recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) as the accrediting agency for both 4-year baccalaureate degree programs and two-year associate degree programs in construction, construction science, construction management, and construction technology. The Council offers accreditation for Master Degree Programs and Recognition of Continuing Education courses for Non-Degree Programs.

Organized in 1974 by the American Institute of Constructors, the constructor's professional organization, and the Associated Schools of Construction, ACCE enjoys the support of the principal building and contracting national associations and academic institutions seeking to satisfy the needs for well educated and trained entrants into the construction profession.

By working together under the aegis of ACCE, persons representative of the total construction community and the public at large, construction educators and constructors, establish and maintain standards and criteria for accreditation, provide guidance to those seeking to achieve accredited status, and carry out the accreditation and reaccreditation processes. In doing so, ACCE serves the interests of potential students by helping them identify institutions and programs that offer quality education in the field, and serves the interests of the industry by enabling employers to identify persons who, by reason of their education and training, have the potential for making lasting contributions to the industry and their profession. ACCE also serves the interests of owners/users of constructed facilities and the public at large by raising the professional caliber of constructors and thus the quality of the construction for which they assume responsibility.

ACCE has developed reciprocal agreements with the National Board for Construction Management Accreditation (NBCMA) of the People's Republic of China and the Canadian Technological Accreditation Board (CTAB). The agreements recognize university degree programs accredited by NBCMA, and CTAB as equivalent to Baccalaureate Degree Programs or Associate Degree Programs accredited by ACCE and the same equivalency for NBCMA, and CTAB accredited Degree Programs.

These agreements are the culmination of a long period of evaluation by all parties embracing academic standards' comparability, exchange of procedural information and reciprocal observation of accreditation visits.



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

During the fiscal year 2011-2012, ACCE continues to work and support its mission of promoting quality education:

* The Standard Committee has engaged a task force led by Richard Burt to develop an outcomes-based assessment process. Richard is working on the curriculum portion. This task force, working with AGC of American Mike Holland, has conducted 3 industry-focused workshops around the country to gain input from industry practitioners on what they expect a new graduate from our CM programs to know and what they can do as a result of earning their degree. This data has been a tremendous effort. Our THANKS to Richard for all his work and dedication.

* Another task force has been convened to look into outcomes-based assessment for everything other than curriculum, this being led by Joe Horlen from TAMU. An overall plan has been developed to develop a complete revision of our assessment procedures with milestones for approval, piloting, fine-tuning and a phased-in implementation.

* ACCE accredited its first Master Degree programs in July 2012. Texas A&M and Clemson University's programs are the first 2 in the nation to have their master degrees in CM accredited. This effort is after several years of dialog, 2 series of pilot projects and final Board approval.

* ACCE has implemented a more intense Visiting Team training requirement, with now an Advanced Member Training course including the Case Study session for all who have completed their initial training and their Member-in-Training visit. This new course will also be required every 3 years to keep our Visiting

Team members up-to-date on our requirements. There will be a phase-in period for all those currently qualified as full members.

* Mark Benjamin has continued his difficult task of facilitating a re-engineering of ACCE's governance model. This re-write of our by-laws and associated policies and procedures continues with an expected completion in July 2013.

In Phoenix, our third Industry Advisory Board Workshop/Round Table was successful and is leading to our fourth (4th) Workshop in Baton Rouge; it continues to improve as does the participation from our industry – those Cajuns are planning quite a happening for this industry-focused event.

ACCE awarded 2 - \$5,000 scholarships in 2012: Heidi Wagner from the University of Minnesota received the Dupree/National Housing Endowment scholarship and James Hogan from Texas A&M received the Dupree Scholarship. Congratulations to both of these future faculty members and ACCE participants.

Sundt Corporation received the 2012 Founder's Award for having a profound impact on construction education. Sundt has a long history of supporting higher education focused on construction through its emphasis on AC and CPC certification from the American Institute of Construction, the financial of educational programs from the Sundt Foundation as well as providing the Sundt district offices the autonomy to contribute locally to programs in their operating area.

The National Housing Endowment has been excited about the progress its H.E.L.P. grant program has performed and how the NHE/Dupree Scholarship has supported residential practitioners obtaining advanced degrees and how they have impacted the education and focus on residential construction at the college and university level. The NHE renewed its grant to ACCE and commit-

tee \$25,000 over 5 years to continue the NHE/ACCE scholarship effort. Our continued thanks to Bruce Silver and Bob Mitchell for their efforts to promote quality education with a residential focus.

In 2011-2012, ACCE made eighteen (18) on-campus visits with two (2) being initial visits. The Accreditation Committee and the Board processes an additional thirty-nine (39) progress and special reports.

Today, ACCE has sixty-nine (69) 4-year programs, twelve (12) 2-year programs accredited and two (2) new Master Degree Programs accredited (total 83) with eleven (11) and nine (9) candidates respectively.

This next year has more work in front of us. Re-engineering governance, continued work on our Outcomes-based Assessment and striving to be the leader in promoting quality construction education as we grow and feel those growing pains will be our challenge. With the support of the talents and time our cadre of volunteers provide, we will continue to meet our goals and will maintain our focus on how we support our mission and our stakeholders.

We thank each of you for your work and dedication: know you have a positive impact on the future of quality construction education.
